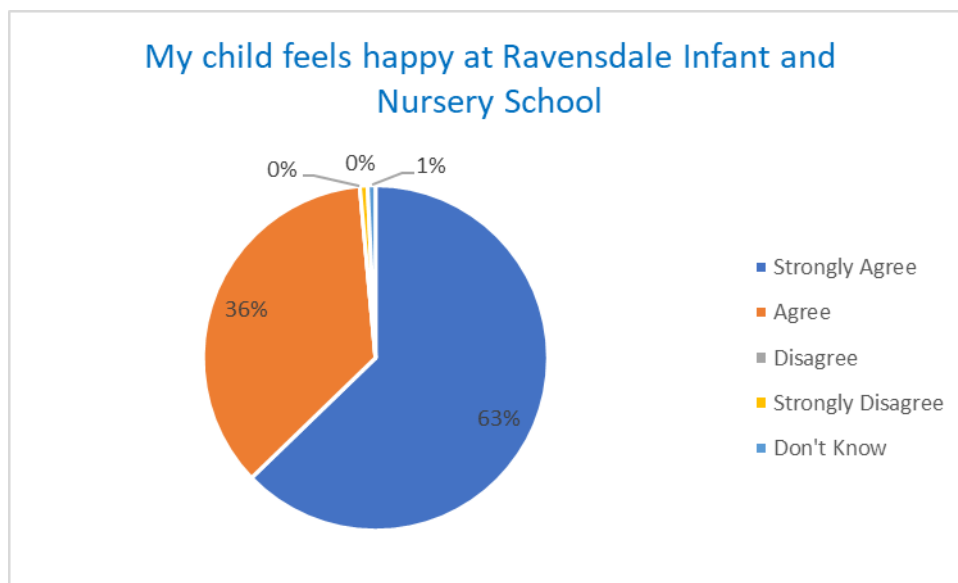

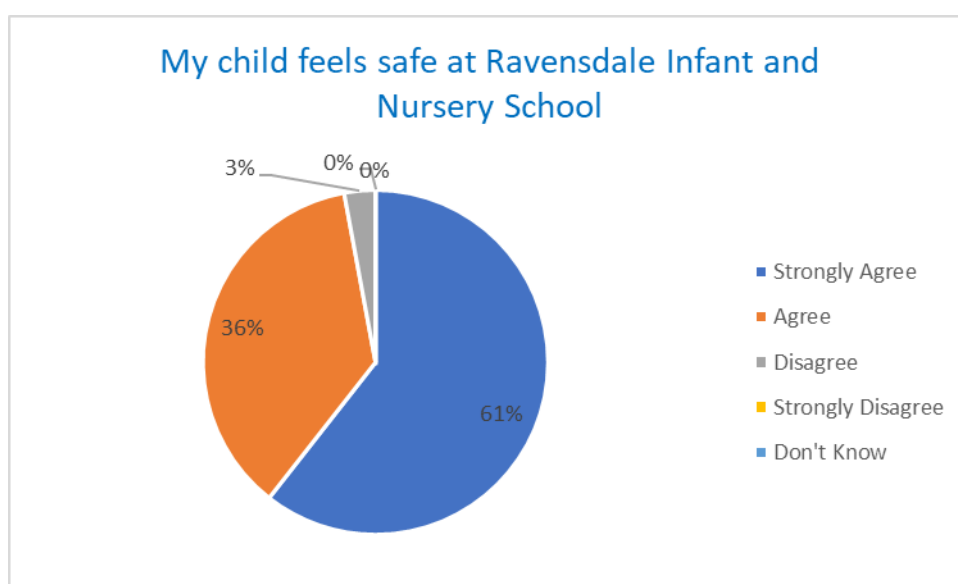
Findings

My child feels happy at Ravensdale Infant and Nursery School:



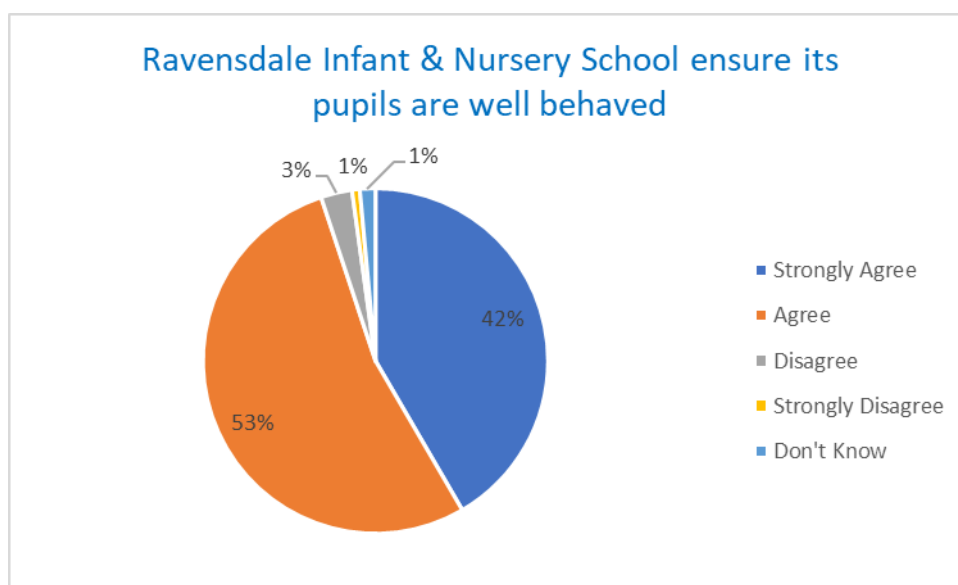
This made us smile, a lot! For so many children to feel happy at school ticks our number one box.

Again, to receive 133 positive responses is great to see. Safeguarding and the safety of the children at school is something we take incredibly seriously and will always be a priority for us.

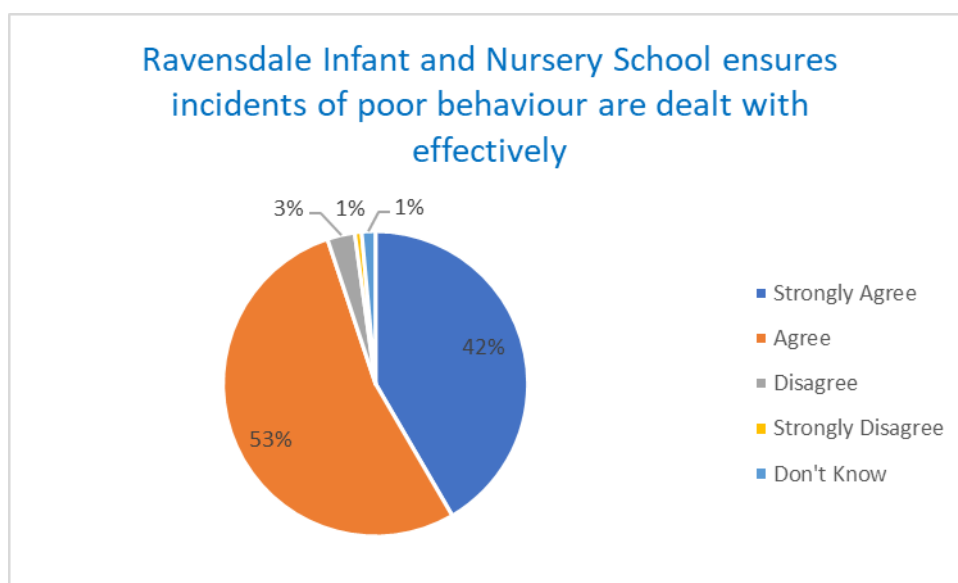
Ravensdale Infant and Nursery School ensures its pupils are well behaved:

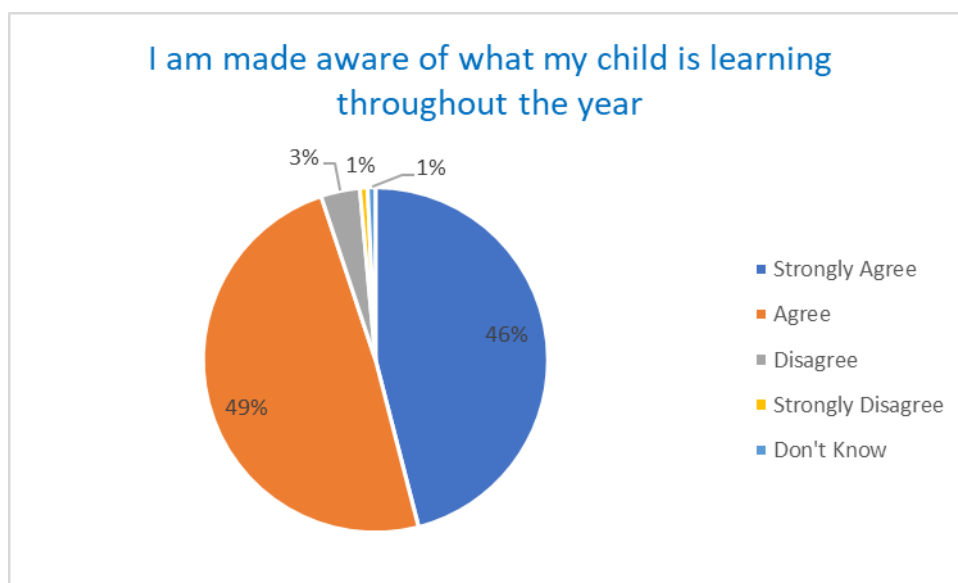
As parents it would be useful for you to read documents sent about new initiatives in school and access our website to find out about what is going on in school.

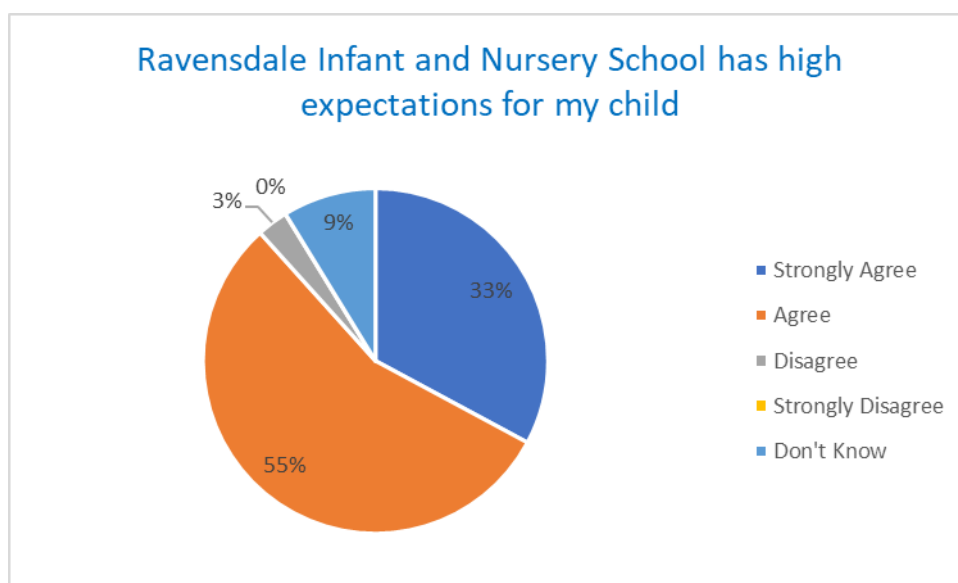
You can communicate with the class teacher via the class email facility or class Dojo – use this also to celebrate achievements with your child.

We have several parent/carers who volunteer in school and see how our high standards are maintained.

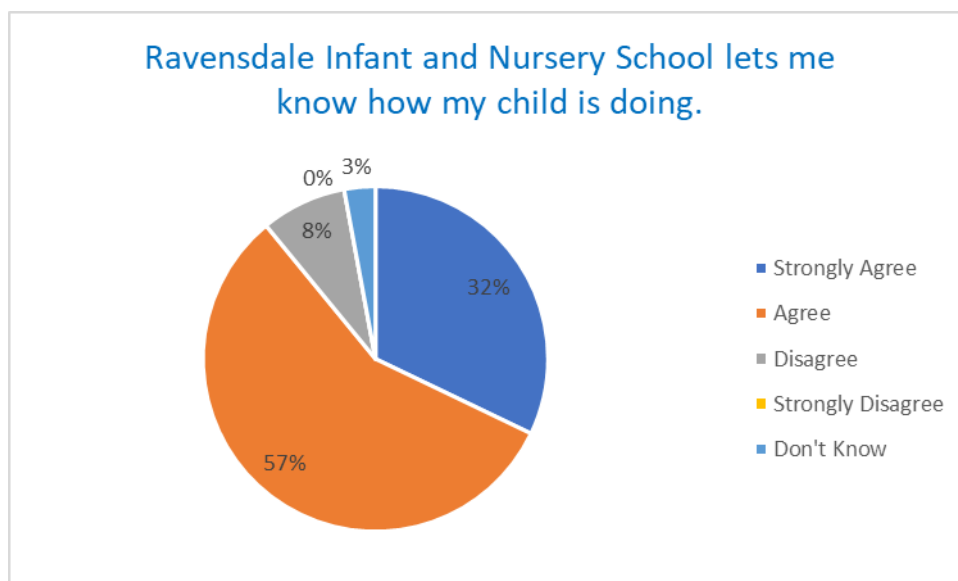
Ravensdale Infant and Nursery School has high expectations for my child:

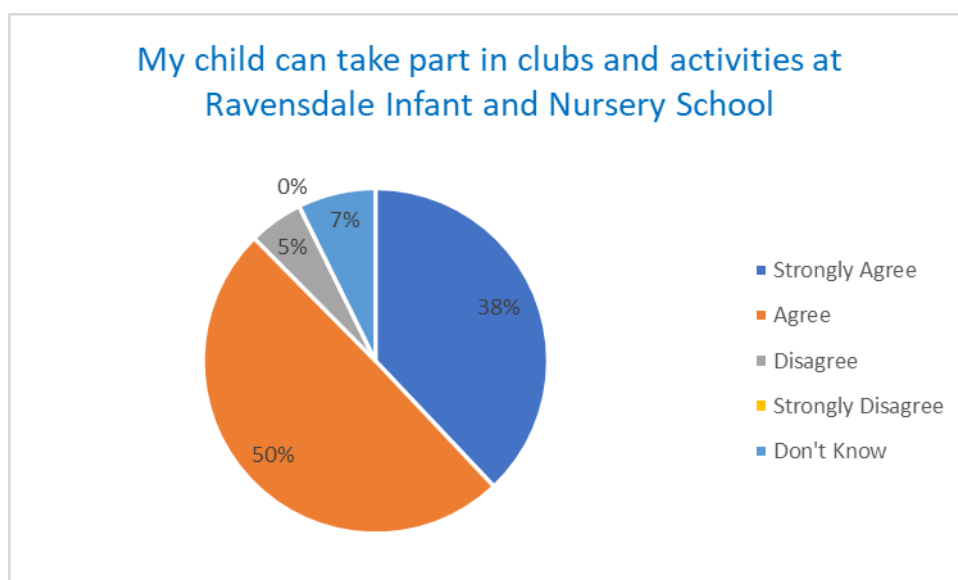
We will continue to build on the parental engagement and curriculum events that you are able to attend.

We have 1 club run by Derby County Community Trust which is by invitation.

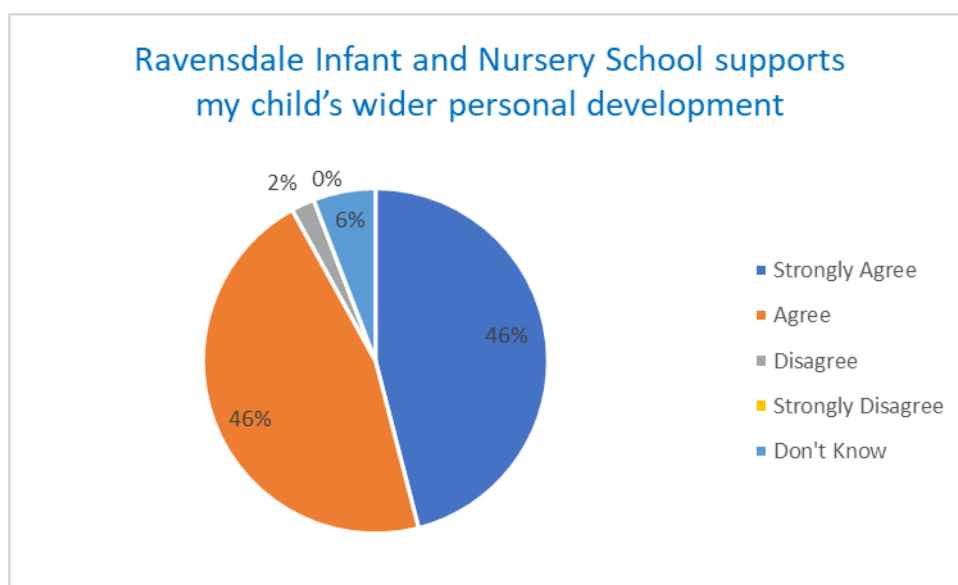
Lego club is run by school staff once a week.

Breakfast club opens at 7.45am each day.

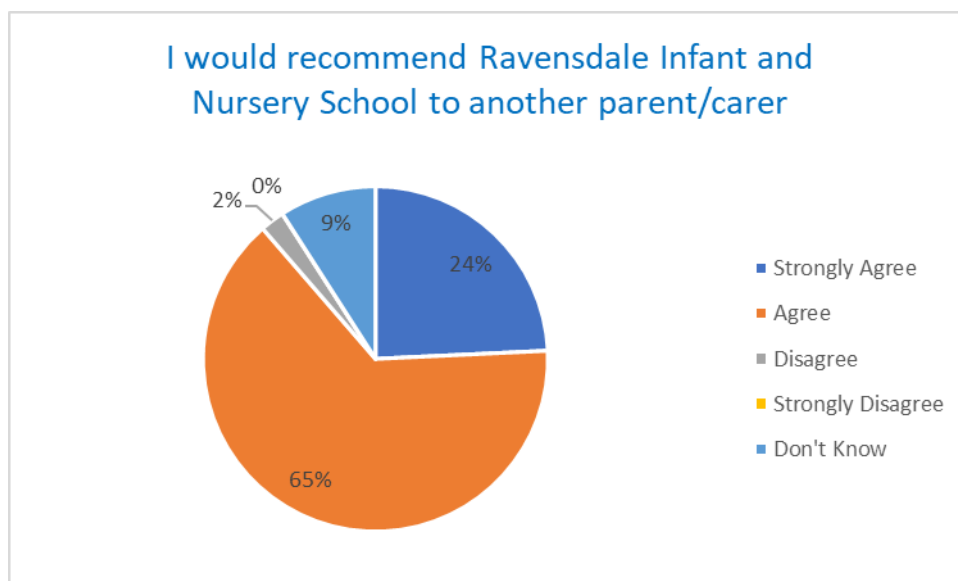

Ravensdale Infant and Nursery School supports my child's wider personal development:



School has really developed the Go Wild curriculum this year to support children's wider personal development. Details can be found on our website - <https://www.ravensdalei.derby.sch.uk/go-wild/>. We also follow the Jigsaw PSHE curriculum, plans can be found on our website at <https://www.ravensdalei.derby.sch.uk/curriculum/>. After school clubs allow for personal development and social skills to be developed. Therapy sessions have been developed through staff training and are provided for those children who need some extra support. In school we currently have Lego Therapy, Emotional Literacy Support (ELSA), Drawing and Talking therapy, Jungle Journey, Nurture and Sensory Circuits. Staff refer children to these therapies and TAs run them during the afternoons.
